Literacy

- Recognizes and names as many as ten letters, especially those in own name
- Identifies the sounds of a few letters
- Orients book correctly, turns pages from the front of the book to the back
- Asks and answers questions about the text and refers to pictures during readalouds
- Writes with mock letters or letter-like forms, then letter strings



Math

- Places objects in two or more groups based on differences in a single characteristic, e.g. color, size, or shape
- Verbally counts to 10
- Counts up to five accurately, using one number to name each object
- Recognizes and names the number of items in a small set (up to five) instantly
- Identifies numerals to 5 by name and connects each to counted objects
- ✤ Copies simple repeating patterns

Social/Emotional

- Is able to manage feelings by looking at a situation differently or delaying gratification
- Manages classroom rules, routines, and transitions with occasional reminders
- Uses successful strategies for entering groups
- Initiates the sharing of materials in the classroom & outdoors
- Suggests solutions to social problems

Gross Motor

- Moves purposefully from place to place will control (e.g. runs, avoids obstacles while moving)
- Rides on tricycle, using pedals
- Jumps off low step, landing on two feet
- Walks forward along beam, watching feet

Language

- Follows directions of two or more steps that relate to familiar objects and experiences
- Engages in conversations of at least three exchanges
- Uses acceptable language & social rules while communicating with others, may need reminders
- Uses complete, 4- to 6-word sentences

Fine Motor

- Uses refined wrist and finger movements
- Begins to hold drawing and writing tools by using a three-point finger grip
- Squeezes and releases tongs, turkey baste squirt toy
- Snips with scissors, then later cuts along straight line

Cognitive

- Plans and pursues a variety of appropriately challenging tasks
- Sustains interest in working on a task, especially when adults offer suggestions, questions and comments
- Thinks symbolically by drawing or constructing objects, and then identifies what it is

Self Help

- Demonstrates confidence in meeting own needs
- Takes off coat and hangs it up
- Puts away toys
- Washes and dries hands
